The end goal is to improve student achievement in every classroom for each district learning goal along with each state and federal requirement.

### **Common Terminology...**

Standard – a broad statement about what students are expected to know and be able to do.

Benchmark – specific knowledge and skills that a student needs to accomplish by a specific grade or grade span.

Essential Learnings - knowledge/skills that ALL students must learn in a content area at a given grade level.

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Phase 3: Implement &amp; Monitor</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Guiding Question:</b>  <b>“How do/will we know that student learning has changed?”</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Develop unit/lesson plans with a focus on the essential learnings</li> <li>▪ Document implementation of curriculum throughout year</li> <li>▪ Reflect/self-monitor</li> <li>▪ Collaborate with grade level, building, and district teams on implementation</li> <li>▪ Participate in local staff development opportunities</li> <li>▪ Attend conferences/workshops</li> <li>▪ Analyze data to monitor changes in student achievement</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Phase 4: Evaluate</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Guiding Question:</b>  <b>“How will we evaluate our programs and service to ensure student learning?”</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Analyze data to determine impact of curriculum</li> <li>▪ Determine which students are not meeting the expectations</li> <li>▪ Determine why</li> <li>▪ Adjust instruction</li> </ul>
