

**BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING
October 17, 2016**

ISSUE: Set Public Hearing for Conveyance of Easement

CONTACT: Lisa Beames, Superintendent

BACKGROUND:

The District has received a proposal to convey part of its land to ITC Midwest LLC, a Michigan limited liability company, for a mainline and anchor electric line easement in the amount of \$3,113.60. Exhibits detailing the proposed conveyance are included in this exhibit.

Pursuant to Iowa Code Section 297.22, notice of the proposed conveyance as well as a hearing to receive and consider objections and petitions pertaining to the cited conveyance must be completed prior to the Boards action.

SUPERINTENDENT'S RECOMMENDATION:

“That this Board shall set a public hearing on the conveyance of said property in attached Resolution for November 7, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room at the Anamosa School Administrative Offices Building, 200 S. Garnavillo Street, Anamosa and that the Board Secretary is authorized and directed to prepare, publish and distribute the Notice of Hearing.”

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Anamosa Community School District (the "District") has received a proposal to convey certain of its land to ITC Midwest LLC, a Michigan limited liability company, (Grantee) for a mainline and anchor electric line easement, in the amount of \$3,113.60. The property is real estate in Jones County, Iowa, further described as follows:

District Property (Quit Claim Deed Bk 120 P 299):

Lot 2 of Lot 5 of Auditor's Plat 1-1928, recorded October 10, 1928, in Recorder's Office in Book C of Plats, Page 100, all located in North one-half (N ½) of Section 10, Township 84 North, Range 4 West of the 5th P.M., Jones County, Iowa

Mainline Easement Property:

That portion of that real property, described in the Quit Claim Deed recorded in Book 120 of Official Records, page 299 in the Office of the County Recorder of Jones County, Iowa, included within a strip of land, 50.00 feet wide, lying 25.00 feet on each side of the following described line:

Commencing at a Stone Monument, set to mark the North Quarter Corner of Section 10, Township 84 North, Range 4 West of the 5th P.M., from which a Mag Nail, set to mark the Northeast Corner of said Section 10, bears S 88°18'01"E, 2690.08 feet; thence, S 44°43'29" E, 1421.47 feet to the Point of Beginning of said line; thence S 50°52'17"E, 511.16 feet to a point hereinafter described as "Point A"; thence, S 17°38'06"E, 187.90 feet to the Point of Terminus of said line.

The sidelines of said strip should be prolonged or shortened so as to begin at the Northwestern line of said property and terminate at the Southerly line of said property. Excepting therefrom, all road Right-of-Way. Containing 0.12 acres more or less.

Anchor Easement Property:

That portion of that real property, described in the Quit Claim Deed recorded in Book 120 of Official Records, page 299 in the office of the County Recorder of Jones County, Iowa, included within a strip of land, 10.00 feet wide, lying 5.00 feet on each side of the following described line:

Beginning at the aforementioned "Point A"; thence, N 55°44'50"E, 74.76 feet to the Point of Termination of said line.

The sidelines of said strip should be prolonged or shortened so as to begin at the Southerly line of said property and terminate at a line running through said Point of Termination at right angles to last said course. Excepting therefrom, all road Right-of-Way. Containing 748 square feet more or less.

WHEREAS, it is appropriate pursuant to Iowa Code Section 297.22 to publish a Notice of the proposed conveyance and of the hearing and to receive and consider objections and petitions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Anamosa Community School District:

Section 1. That this Board shall set a public hearing on the conveyance of the above-described Property for November 7, 2016, at 7:00 pm., in the Board Room at the Anamosa School Administrative Office Building, 200 S. Garnavillo, Anamosa, Iowa.

Section 2. That the Secretary is authorized and directed to prepare, publish, and distribute the Notice of Hearing.

AGREEMENT REGARDING EASEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and effective this ___ day of _____, 20__ by and between Anamosa Community School District, 200 South Garnavillo St., Anamosa, Iowa 52205, (“Landowner”), and ITC Midwest LLC, a Michigan limited liability company (a subsidiary of ITC Holdings Corp, a Michigan corporation), 27175 Energy Way, Novi, Michigan 48377, (“ITCM”) (collectively, Landowner and ITCM may be referred to herein as the “Parties”).

RECITALS

A. On _____, 20__, Landowner, as Grantor, entered into an easement with ITCM, as Grantee (the “Easement”) contemporaneously with this Agreement, on certain land described in the Easement.

B. As consideration for the Easement, ITCM agreed to pay the following sum (the “Total Payment”):

C. In addition to the terms and conditions in the Easement, Landowner and ITCM agreed to certain additional terms and conditions as further consideration for the grant of the Easement by Landowner to ITCM, as set forth herein.

NOW, therefore, in consideration of the promises and covenants herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the adequacy, receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. ITCM shall pay the Total Payment prior to the commencement of construction activities on Landowner’s land, or within 60 days of receipt of all municipal and regulatory approvals necessary to commence construction, whichever is sooner

2. ITCM shall negotiate with Landowner and make separate payment for damages caused by the exercise of the rights granted by the Easement promptly upon completion of ITCM’s construction project; provided, Landowner reserves the right to submit additional claims for

damages that were not apparent at the time of the work and which were not otherwise compensated in accordance with the ITC Midwest Damage Claims Policy Statement.

3. Landowner acknowledges and agrees that this Agreement Regarding Easement is personal to Landowner, that it is not assignable by Landowner, and that it shall not run with the land. ITCM may assign its rights, duties and obligations under this Agreement to ITCM's principal or subsidiaries, affiliates or subsidiaries of its principal or to any entity which acquires all or substantially all of ITCM's assets in the market by reason of a merger, acquisition or other business reorganization. Said assignment shall be effective upon ITCM sending written notice to Landowner at Landowner's above stated mailing address.

4. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to modify, restrict, increase or otherwise change the Easement.

5. This Agreement shall not be recorded by either party hereto without the written consent of the other party.

6. Landowner represents and warrants to ITCM that he/she is the sole owner(s) of the Property and has the full authority and power to enter into this Agreement and the Easement.

7. Landowner shall not disclose the consideration paid for the Easement, nor any other information concerning this Agreement, and agrees not participate in any action, or make any statement of any type related in any way to the subject matters of this Agreement, except that this Agreement shall not prohibit the Parties from complying with any law, court order or other legal process.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties have executed this Agreement as of the day and year set forth above.

BY SIGNING THIS DOCUMENT THE PARTIES ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THEY HAVE READ AND UNDERSTOOD THE FOREGOING TERMS AND AGREE TO THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS THEREIN.

ELECTRIC LINE EASEMENT

For good and other valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, **Anamosa Community School District**, 200 South Garnavillo Street, Anamosa, Iowa 52205 (“Grantor(s)”), do(es) hereby warrant and convey unto ITC Midwest LLC, a Michigan limited liability company, 27175 Energy Way, Novi, MI 48377, its successor and assigns, (“Grantee”), a perpetual easement with the right, privilege and authority to construct, reconstruct, maintain, upgrade, operate, repair, patrol, replace and remove an electric and telecommunications line or lines, consisting of poles, towers, crossarms, insulators, wires, guy wires, anchors and other necessary fixtures, equipment and construction for transmitting electricity, communications and all Corporate purposes together with the power to extend to any other party the right to use, jointly with the Grantee, pursuant to the provisions hereof, upon, under, over and across the following described lands (the “**Premises**”). The Easement shall be limited to that certain part of the Premises described Legal Description as the “**Easement Area**” located in the County of Jones and the State of Iowa:

LEGAL DESCRIPTION: The real property described in the Quitclaim Deed recorded in Book 120 of Official Records, page 299 in the office of the County Recorder of Jones County, Iowa.

EASEMENT AREA: See Attached Exhibit A-1.

ANCHOR EASEMENT AREA: See Attached Exhibit A-1.

In addition to the foregoing, Grantor hereby grants to Grantee the following related rights necessary or convenient for Grantee’s use of the Easement: (i) an easement to enter upon the Premises to survey for and locate the Electric Lines; (ii) an easement for ingress and egress over and across the Premises to the Easement Area, by means of existing field roads and lanes, if any, otherwise by the use of the most reasonable and feasible route selected by Grantee in its reasonable discretion; and (iii) an easement to remove, cut, trim, destroy or otherwise control any or all trees, shrubs bushes, or brush now or hereafter standing or growing upon or within the Easement Area and further, the right and privilege to trim, cut down or control the growth of such other trees standing or growing on land adjacent thereto as in the judgment of the Grantee may interfere with construction, reconstruction, maintenance, operation, repair, use of, or which in falling might touch the said line or lines, all at Grantee’s sole and absolute discretion.

Together with all the rights and privileges for the full enjoyment or use thereof for the aforesaid purpose. Grantor shall not erect any buildings, structures or other objects, permanent or temporary (collectively referred to herein as “**Structures**”), upon the Easement Area. Grantor further agrees not to plant any trees within the Easement Area without prior express written consent from Grantee, nor to perform any act which will interfere with or endanger the Electric Lines.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantor reserves the right to cultivate, use, and occupy the Easement Area in a manner that is not inconsistent with Grantee’s rights granted herein. Grantor

Easement Area without prior notice and without responsibility for any damage that occurs as a result of such removal. In the event a fence currently exists within the Easement Area as of the date of this Easement (each, a "Permitted Fence"), Grantee may: (1) install and maintain a gating system in the Permitted Fence, of Grantee's choice, in order to obtain access to the Easement Area for the purposes of construction and maintenance of the Electric Lines; and (2) cause such Permitted Fence to be removed as Grantee deems necessary provided that Grantee restores such Permitted Fence to substantially the same condition as it existed prior to removal.

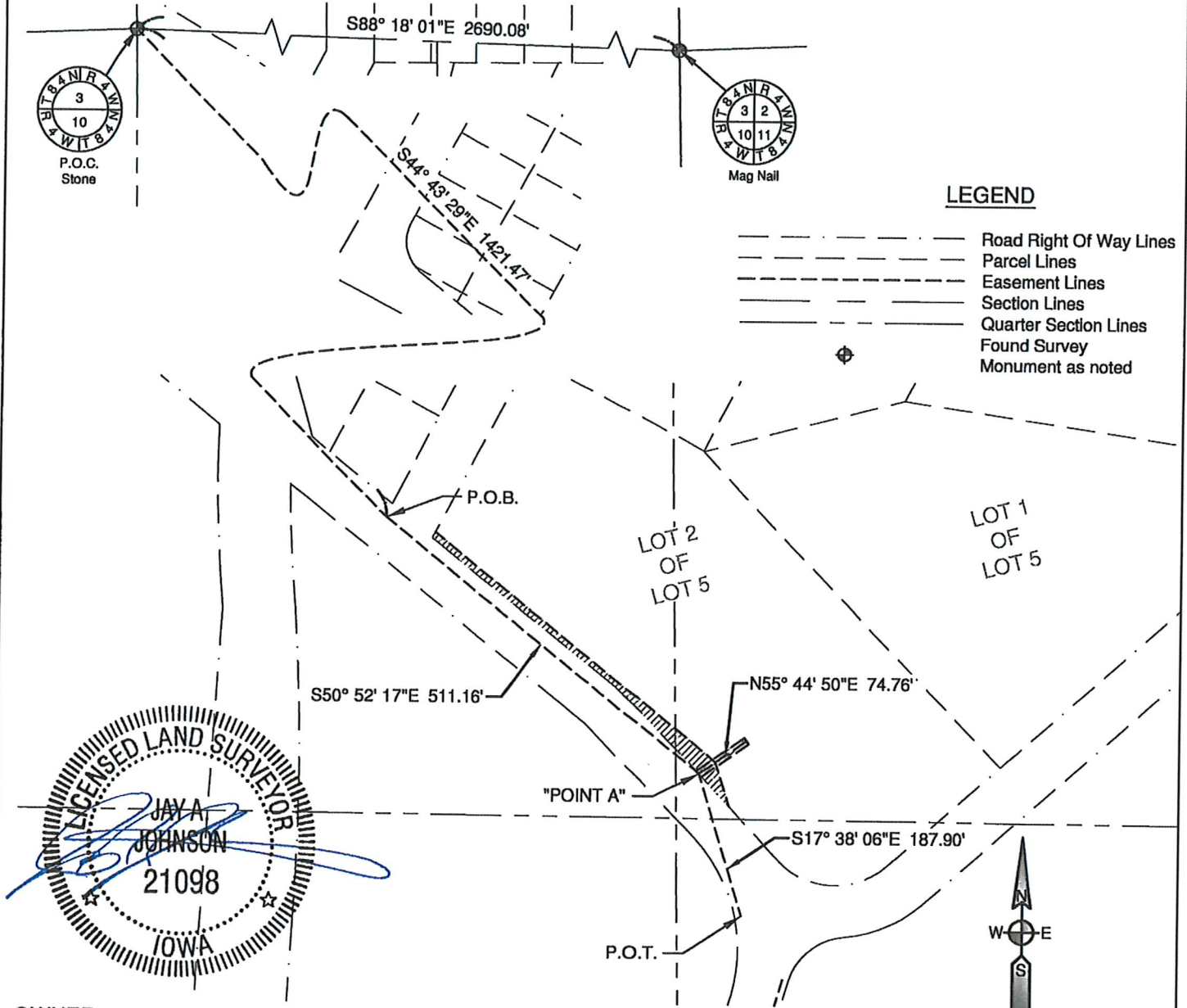

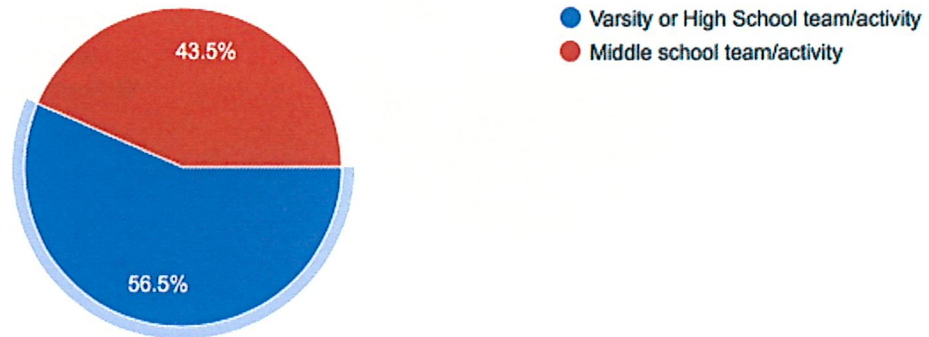

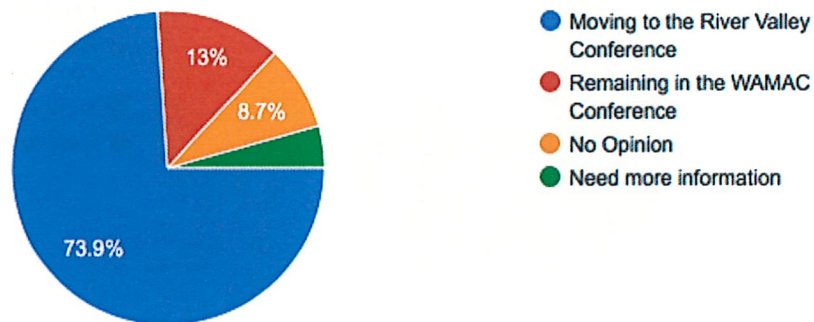

Coaches Survey Results

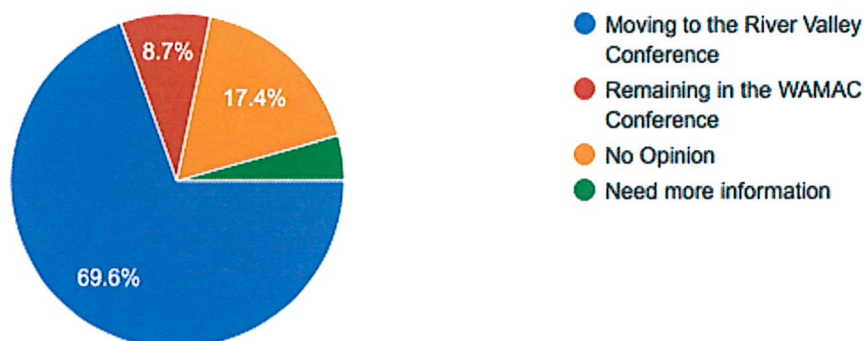
I am a Coach or Sponsor of: (23 responses)



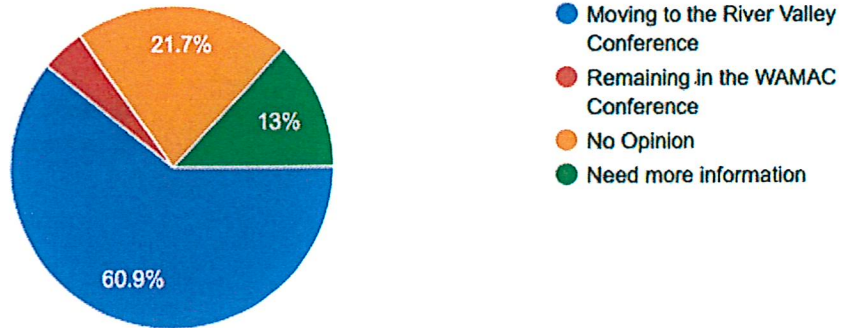
As a coach, I recommend: (23 responses)



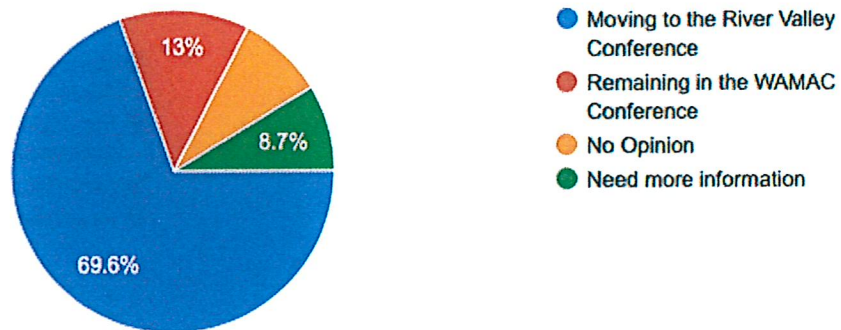
High school activity programs would benefit more from: (23 responses)

Wrestling- WAMAC is state's toughest conference for schools of its size; RVC is state's toughest for schools of its size.

Boys/Girls Basketball- WAMAC is tough every year and it is tough to compete with larger schools on a yearly basis; RVC has some "basketball schools" to provide a challenging schedule

Baseball/Softball- WAMAC an annual power for 3A schools, RVC Annual power for 2A schools (good move)

Baseball and Softball play at the same site, same date so the number of nights workers are needed is less than the WAMAC

Basketball -the RVC playing boys and girls at the same site. It cuts the number of nights the school and the boosters need help in half; theoretically, crowds are twice as big but only half as often.

Cross Country- Both only have a conference meet, not a conference schedule. Monticello, Cascade, and Regina are traditional powers; WAMAC has power in numbers

BACKGROUND:

Care and Maintenance of District Athletic Fields

The board will consider the creation of a position to ensure appropriate care and preparation of outdoor athletic fields/ complexes. It is proposed that this is a full-time position and that during the months of December-February this position provide additional support with winter weather work and general operations of the buildings and grounds department.

This position will be within the Buildings and Grounds Department and evaluation jointly by this department and the Activities director.

This position is proposed to be a 35 hour per week position at an anticipated cost of approximately \$45,000 per year including FICA, IPERS and Insurance. (Base salary of \$33,743)

The primary goals of this position are as follows:

- *Care and maintenance for the district's outdoor fields/complexes:*
 - Maintain performance or practice field including mowing, weeding as well as ensuring proper fertilization and weed control
 - Maintain structures associated with identified sites
 - Monitor repair needs and report to supervisor as appropriate
 - Ensure restroom facilities for fields as appropriate
 - Coordinate cleaning and/or clean restroom facilities
 - Ensure appropriate litter and garbage pick-up/disposal
 - Provide appropriate field set-up for practices and performances per Athletic Director's specifications
- *Support with winter preparations and additional operational needs due to winter weather.*
- *General buildings and grounds operational support*

THE BOARD'S RECOMMENDATION IS:

Approve the creation of a position to ensure appropriate care and preparation of outdoor athletic fields and complexes as well as to provide additional support for buildings and grounds operational needs.
