A 1.5% package increase is proposed for the Technology Director. This includes changing the district paid health insurance to the Copay 1500 plan. The salary increase computes to a 1.23% increase with the IPERS making up the rest of the 1.5% package. Also to be added to the letter of employment is the agreement to review the District's financial position in June 2011 to consider a salary adjustment and review the benefit structure for this position.

ISSUE: Workers Compensation Carrier for 2010-2011

BACKGROUND:

The District's workers compensation policy runs July 1-June 30th each year. United Heartland is the current carrier and has been since 2007-2008. The District has received five quotes for coverage effective 7/1/10. The quotes are listed on the attached summary.

The attached summary compares the plans and discusses some of the differences. State Fund Mutual (SFM) has the lowest bid and is recommended by our broker, Holmes Murphy. SFM is the largest worker's compensation carrier in Minnesota and works only in the workers compensation line of insurance. They provide safety and loss control services and provide resources for the district in these areas.

THE RECOMMENDATION IS:

"the Board of Education approve State Fund Mutual as the workers compensation insurance effective July 1, 2010."

Code No.: 202.1

PRESIDENT

Purpose: To outline the duties of the Board President.

Policy: The President of the Board shall preside at all Board meetings; sign warrants, drafts, and all orders drawn upon the Treasurer as provided by law; sign all contracts made by the Board; and appear in behalf of the Corporation in all actions brought by or against it, unless individually a party, in which case this duty shall be performed by the Vice-President. The President shall assist the Superintendent in preparation of the meeting agenda.

The Board President may sign athletic contest contracts and official contracts by use of a signature stamp.
