

# OFFICIAL NOTICE OF THE CITY & SCHOOL ELECTION

## TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 2, 2021 - POLLS OPEN 7:00 A.M. TO 8:00 P.M.

**NOTICE OF ELECTION:** The polls for the city and school election on Tuesday November 2, 2021 will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Voters must vote in their precinct and polling place of residence. You may verify the voting location for your home address at: <https://sos.iowa.gov/elections/voterreg/pollingplace/search.aspx>. Precinct maps are located on the Jones County Election website. The voting locations and addresses for this election are as follows:

- **Anamosa** - Lawrence Community Center, 600 E. Main St., Anamosa IA (For voters in the Anamosa North/Cass, Anamosa South/Jackson, and Fairview precincts—includes the City of Anamosa, & Cass, Fairview, & Jackson Townships.)
- **Greenfield** - Martelle Fire Station, 212 Iowa St., Martelle IA (For voters in the City of Martelle & Greenfield Township.)
- **Monticello Voting Location** - Berdes Center, 766 N. Maple St., Monticello IA (For voters in the Monticello 1, 2, 3, & 4 city precincts and the Castle Grove/Lovell/Wayne precinct — includes the City of Monticello, & Castle Grove, Lovell, & Wayne Townships.)
- **Oxford\*** - Oxford Junction Community Center, 105 E. Broadway St., Oxford Junction IA (For voters in the City of Oxford Junction & Oxford Township.)
- **Richland/Washington** - Cascade EMS Center, 803 1st Ave. W., Cascade IA (For voters in the City of Cascade-Jones County portion, & Richland & Washington Townships.)
- **Rome/Hale** - Olin School Community Rm., 301 Parkway St., Olin IA (For voters in the cities of Morley & Olin, & Hale & Rome Townships.)
- **Scotch Grove/Madison/Clay** - Onslow Community Rm., 105 S. Main St., Onslow IA (For voters in the city of Onslow, & Clay, Madison, & Scotch Grove Townships.)
- **Wyoming\*** - Calkins Barn, 104 E. Main St., Wyoming IA (For voters in the City of Wyoming & Wyoming Township.)

*\*Notice of polling place change: the Oxford and Wyoming precincts have moved to a different polling location. Registered voters in the precinct were mailed a notification of change the week of September 20th.*

All polling places for this election are handicapped accessible, however, any voter who is physically unable to enter the polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle. **Please note: Linn County voters residing in the Anamosa Community School District must vote in Linn County. Please contact the Linn County Auditor's office for Linn County polling place information.**

**PROOF OF IDENTIFICATION:** Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by noon on Monday, November 8, 2021. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification. **ABSENTEE VOTING IN THE AUDITOR'S OFFICE:** Absentee ballots are available at the Jones County Auditor's office and may be voted in the office until 5:00 P.M., Monday, November 1, 2021.

**ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL:** The deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail has passed. If you received a ballot by mail, it must be returned to the Auditor's office no later than 8:00 P.M. on Tuesday, November 2. Postmark dates do not count. Absentee ballots CANNOT be placed in the drop box outside of the Courthouse. **VOTER ACCESSIBILITY:** All voting sites are fully accessible to persons with physical disabilities. Each site also has a voter assist ballot marking device which allows persons with sight disabilities to vote independently. The device allows voters to make their selections using an audio read-back and touchpad, or touchscreen. The touchscreen option provides magnification and reverse black and white images. Voters unable to see the screen may have the screen turned off and use only the audio read-back and touchpad features. The audio read-back feature provides all ballot instructions, choices, and selections in an audio format using headphones. After making selections with the ballot marking device, via touchpad or touchscreen, the device will mark the voter's paper ballot and the voter will insert their marked ballot in the regular ballot tabulator used for all other ballots. Voters may also choose another person to assist them to vote, except their employer, employer's agent, or an officer or agent of the voter's union.

Any voter who is physically unable to enter the polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle. For further information please contact the County Auditor's office at the following telephone or TTY number or e-mail:

All of these accessibility options are also generally available at the courthouse for absentee voting through Monday, November 1, 2021 at 5:00 p.m.

**ELECTION RESULTS:** Results for city, school, and community college races and measures may come from more than one county depending on the boundaries of the city, school district, or community college. Most counties in Iowa will be reporting their results to a single web-site hosted by the Iowa Secretary of State so that voters may see the combined results for all races and measures. The link to that site will be posted on the Jones County election website: [www.jonescountyiowaelections.gov](http://www.jonescountyiowaelections.gov). In addition, the Jones County Auditor may post the unofficial results for certain contested races for various cities in Jones County on the Jones County Elections website. Results are not final until the final canvass is conducted, which may be one to three weeks after the election, depending on the jurisdiction.

**Summary:** To adopt a Revenue Purpose Statement specifying the use of revenues the Anamosa Community School District will receive from the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund.

In the Anamosa Community School District, the following Revenue Purpose Statement which specifies the use of revenues the Anamosa Community School District will receive from the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund shall be adopted.

To provide funds to acquire or install information technology infrastructure (including improving buildings or sites for the purpose of accessing broadband digital telecommunications) and school safety and security infrastructure.

To provide funds to build and furnish a new school building or buildings; to build and furnish addition(s) to school buildings in the District; to remodel, reconstruct, repair, expand, and improve the school buildings in the District; to purchase and improve grounds; for demolition work; to furnish and equip district facilities.

To provide funds for the purchase, lease or lease-purchase of buildings, equipment (including transportation and recreation equipment), or technology and to repair transportation equipment for transporting students as authorized by law, to implement energy conservation measures, sharing or rental of facilities including a joint infrastructure project for the purposes of offering classes under district-to-community college programs as authorized in Iowa Code Section 423F.3(3)(c), procuring or acquisition of libraries, or opening roads to schoolhouses or buildings.

To provide funds to purchase land as part of start-up costs for new student construction program or if the sale of the previous student construction was insufficient to purchase land, and to purchase construction materials and supplies for a student-constructed building or shed intended to be retained by and used by the District.

To provide funds to make payments to a municipality or other entity as required under Iowa Code Section 403.19(2).

To provide funds for demolition, cleanup, and other costs if such costs are necessitated by, and incurred within two years of, a disaster.

To provide funds to establish and maintain public recreation places and playgrounds; provide for supervision and instruction for recreational activities; or for community education purposes.

To provide funds for the payment of principal and interest or retirement of general obligation bonds issued for school infrastructure purposes, energy improvement loans, loan agreements authorized by Iowa Code Section 297.36, sales, service and use tax revenue bonds issued under Iowa Code Section 423E.5 or Iowa Code Section 423F.4.

To provide funds for property tax relief; and

To provide funds for other authorized expenditures and purposes as now or hereafter permitted by law and designated by the Anamosa Community School District.

It being understood that if this proposition should fail to be approved by the voters, such failure shall not be construed to terminate or restrict authority previously granted by the voters to expend receipts from the Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund.

If approved, this Revenue Purpose Statement shall remain in effect until replaced or amended by the Anamosa Community School District.

Additional information regarding Public Measure MD, as provided by the Anamosa Community School District, that is not included on the ballot:

If a majority of eligible electors voting on the question fail to approve this Revenue Purpose Statement, then upon expiration of the current Revenue Purpose Statement, revenues received by the School District from the Secure an Advanced Vision for Education fund shall be expended in the following order:

The payment of bonds for which SAVE Revenue has been pledged;

Reduction of bond levies under Iowa Code Sections 298.18 and 298.18A and all other debt levies;

Reduction of the regular and voter-approved physical plant and equipment levy under Iowa Code Section 298.2;

Reduction of the public educational and recreational levy under Iowa Code Section 300.2;

For any authorized infrastructure purpose of the school district as defined in Iowa Code Section 423F.3(6); and

For the payment of principal and interest on bonds issued under Iowa Code Sections 423E.5 and 423F.4.
